ELIZABETH DUNCAN KOONTZ

ELIZABETH DUNCAN KOONTZ was a member of St. Philip's Episcopal Church in Salisbury before joining St. Luke's when St. Philip's merged into this Parish. She was born June 3, 1919 to Lena and Samuel Duncan, both educators. Ms. Koontz attended segregated schools in Salisbury and graduated as Salutatorian from Price High School. She earned a Bachelor's in English and Elementary Education from Livingstone College, a Master's from Atlanta University. She would go on to be a teacher, the first African-American President of the National Education Association, and the first African-American director of the Women's Bureau of the US Department of Labor, being appointed by President Richard Nixon. Ms. Koontz was a leader in education, civil rights, and the women's movement. She died in Salisbury on January 6, 1989. We are lifting up this local saint for her faithful witness and that she might later receive consideration to be added to the sanctoral calendar of The Episcopal Church.

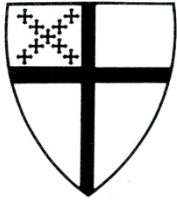
